1. Welcome to the Tobacco Free Arizona State University

- Arizona State University is now tobacco free, joining approximately 800 colleges and universities nationwide that have kicked the habit.
- As of Sept 2 there were 27 signatures on Miguel D.'s petition "University Senate at ASU: Repeal the Campus Tobacco Ban".
- 2. ASU attracts top faculty, this year there are 130 new tenured/tenure-track faculty members, which means that about 1 in every 14 tenure-track/tenured faculty members at ASU are new.
- There are 113 prominent and influential faculty members holding endowed chairs and professorships.



3. Student Enrollment

- Projected total enrollment for Arizona State University is 76,000 students
- Freshmen enrollment grew to 10,149 students, 900 students higher than the fall 2012 entering class.
- The ASU student athlete graduation rates are at their highest level.
- Senior Associate Athletic Director Jean Boyd and Basketball Coach Herb Sendek will speak at the 2nd University Senate meeting on October 7th.
- 4. The Senate Office is working with the Provost's Office to make the technical corrections to the Constitution and ACD Manual to reflect the 'Office of Graduate Education' in place of 'the Graduate College'.



5. Summary of the Recent Merit based Salary Adjustment that took place in March and April of 2013

 Overall 79% of those eligible (out of all faculty and Staff members received an average merit increase of 3.5%.



8. Task Force on Institutional Ethics and Integrity at ASU

- After reviewing the existing policies for ethics and integrity, and the previous efforts of the Senate 2004 and 2011 Ad Hoc Committees, the task force will define the desired culture of institutional ethics and integrity at Arizona State University and assist in delivering the message.



9. Pac-12

Since April 13 the academic senate leadership of the Pac-12 conference and the ASU University Senate Office has been working toward proposing similar features from the Big-10 Committee on Institution Cooperation (CIC), and the Southeastern Conference - SEC Academic Consortium (SECAC). The working group is progressing toward a developmental web site (not public) that features the mission, the institutions, issues related to academics and research, as well as faculty development and governance. I believe using the developmental website would be the best way to communicate the initial capabilities of the Pac-12 ARC to the consortium members. The goal is to have consensus with the working group by September and the entire consortium by the November 2nd meeting at Oregon.
