1. Task Force on Institutional Ethics and Integrity at ASU

4. Ad-Hoc Committee on Resources and Protocol for Domestic Violence and Intimate Partner Abuse had met February 11 with the goal of creating a easily accessible Website connected to the ASU website that provides information and support services.

This Ad-Hoc Committee should be able to deliver its work by either the March 31st or April 28 senate meeting.

5. The Task Force for Constitution and By-Law Changes held their last meeting on February 28 and submitted their final edits to me earlier today. The first read of these changes to the By-Laws will be at the March 31st Senate meeting, with the final vote at the April 28th meeting.

The Academic Assembly must vote on the Senate approved Constitution changes, and only the Senate must vote on the By-Law changes.



6. The Data Archive Task Force (DATF) was convened in the late fall of 2013 as a subcommittee of the Research and Creative Activities Committee (RCA) with the task of considering university policies toward the archiving of research data, including both data accessibility and infrastructure, particularly with regard to upcoming changes in federal policy toward data accessibility for funded research.

The DATF submitted their report to the Senate Office on Friday, Feb 28th and this will be posted on the senate website for further review. The first read of the DATF Report will be at the March 31st Senate meeting and the discussion and vote will be at the April 28th Senate meeting.

Did You Know?

Every search committee formed at ASU to evaluate applicants for the administrative position of Dean, University Librarian, or Provost must have at least one faculty member or academic professional that is a Senator. The chair of the University Academic Council is tasked with making this appointment. You can read more on this subject at ACD 505-05.

A Common Misconception

ASU does not have a way in which faculty members can quickly introduce a new course or provide a course on a trial/experimental basis.

False: Omnibus numbers are used for courses offered on an experimental, or tutorial basis or for courses in which the content is new or periodically changes. Academic units use their prefixes with omnibus course numbers. The general nature of the work required for a particular omnibus course is consistent from unit to unit, but subject matter varies. Omnibus courses are often offered for a variable number of credit hours. Omnibus courses that have been offered at least twice are eligible to be submitted as a new
