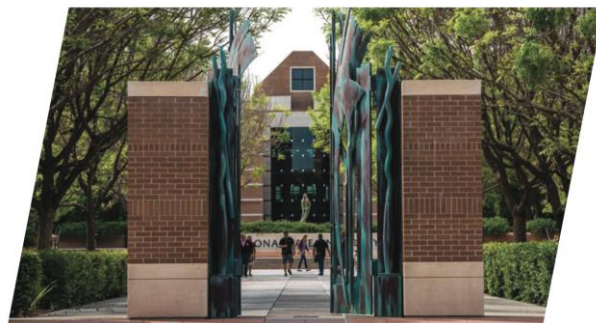

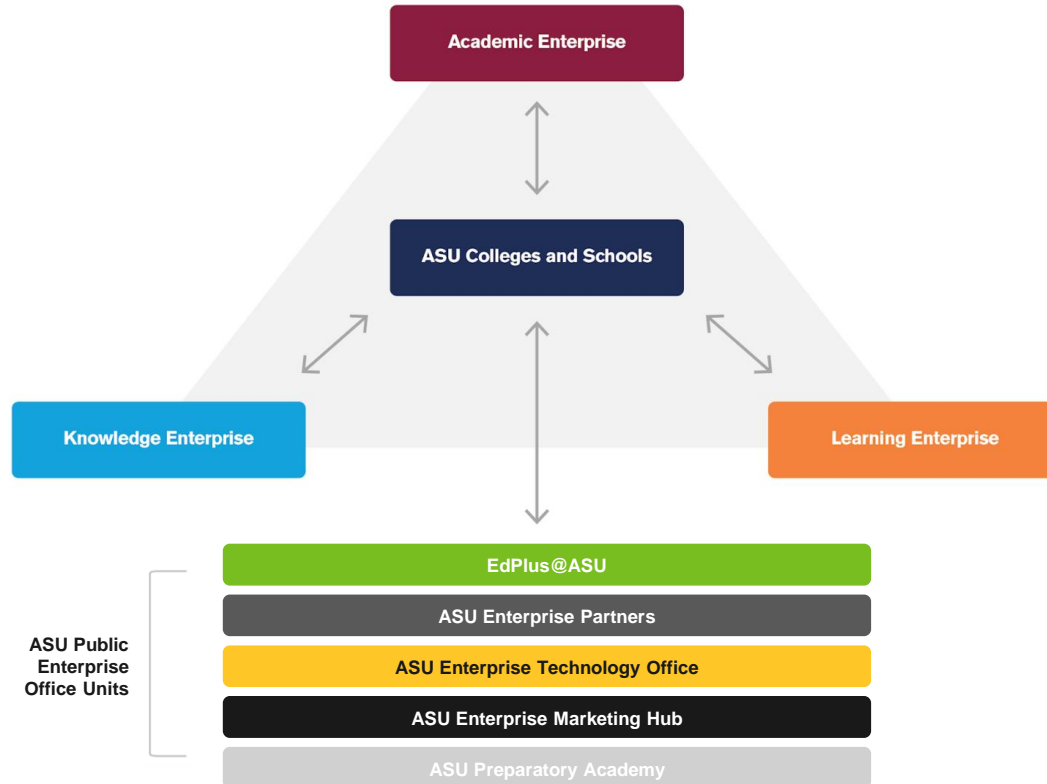

## Executive Vice President ASU Health


In July 2023, ASU named Dr. Sherine Gabriel executive vice president of [ASU Health](#).

Prior to her appointment, Dr. Gabriel served as University Professor of the Future of Health Outcomes and Medicine and chair of the ASU Health Outcomes Design Council.

She has dedicated her career to improving health and advancing innovative education, training and equitable health outcomes as a medical systems leader, an educator, a population scientist and a clinical rheumatologist.

In addition to numerous professional appointments with Mayo Clinic, including her role as dean of its medical school, Gabriel has been dean of the Rutgers Robert Wood Johnson Medical School and president of Rush University in Chicago. Rush University is a nationally ranked academic medical center and includes a medical college, college of nursing, college of health sciences and graduate college.
