3. Informational Reports

a. Mark Searle, Executive Vice President and University Provost

Provost Searle reported that in addition to enrollment growth, the quality of the freshmen class is up substantially, including a 20 percent increase in Dean's Scholars. Approximately two-thirds of University courses

have transitioned to Canvas for the spring semester. The University needs to make better use of ePortfolios. There are approximately 150,000 ePortfolios, including 6,000 alumni. Faculty need to use this tool as a direct learning assessment. The Arizona Board of Regents is always asking about learning outcomes and digital portfolios are a great tool for demonstrating learning outcomes. Interfolio is a new tool that departments can use for hiring. It will eventually include components for faculty reporting and promotion and tenure.

Recent incidents demonstrate an increasing level of national violence and a shift in dialogue. The university is a place where dialogue can happen about contentious and difficult subjects. We need to build an institution for learning but also where students can learn to constructively address ideas. Faculty need to help students communicate and critically analyze these events. University leadership, Senate and staff leadership -- all University leaders share responsibility to help the university plan and decide what the university does and ensure that students thrive. The university will be working on several new items, such as general education that is undergoing a long overdue overhaul.

In response to questions, Provost Searle mentioned that the University is considering scooters on campus and working with the scooter companies. He also answered a question about the university's ethical standards for engaging with foreign countries, that ASU has criteria pertaining to international outreach and who it does business with. He responded to a concern about students feeling safe, that the administration is working to help all students feel safe and looking at ways to bring students together. Finally, Provost Searle acknowledged the significance of the University Senate's efforts to change current policy regarding amorous relationships.

4. UAC Chair's Report – Donna Cataldo, Senate President and Chair of the University Academic Council

This month's Senator Spotlight features John Dallmus from the WP Carey School of Business. The election for the next University Senate President-elect and University Academic Council Chair-elect is coming up soon; this person will be selected by December 2018. The elections for campus president-elect will take place in the spring. The PAC 12 Academic Leadership Coalition meeting is January 25-27, 2019 and ASU University Senate is sending attendees. The Personnel Committee received word regarding a final Provost approval for a policy change that now provides 6 weeks of paid parental leave per individual for ASU employed faculty and staff; previously, the policy permitted 6 weeks of shared leave between spouses.
