Senate Motion 2012-28 Resolution on SB 1474 - WEAPONS; UNIVERSITY; COLLEGE GROUNDS

A suspension of the rules was moved and seconded. A vote was taken of all the campuses with electronic clickers (including a hand count at Downtown).
