

University Committee Review – ad hoc Final Report 2-15-2017

Charge

In adherence to the spirit of University Senate Constitution bylaw II. D. The committee should research and review University standing committees (Provost, President, OKED, etc.) with the following preliminary goals in mind: compile a list of committees most important to the Senate, explore ways in which communication can be improved between these committees and the Senate, evaluate current levels of faculty representation, make additional recommendations as appropriate.

The committee will also review Bylaw II. D. of the Senate constitution and provide feedback on whether changes to this bylaw are needed and/or warranted. This feedback and any possible change recommendations will be provided to the Bylaws Review Task Force.

Review process

After its initial meeting the committee members split each of the committees listed on the Provost roster of boards committees and councils amongst each of the four campus presidents. Using the information on the Provost website, each of the committee members compiled information on the following topics (see appendix A):

After reviews were performed the committee convened to discuss each of the committees individually in order to make a final determination on each of the issues presented in the graphic above. One of the committee's goals was to develop a list of committees that the Senate would request an annual report. A second list was developed to codify University committees that the Senate would annually offer assistance (fall semester). The final classification was to develop a list of committees that could benefit from a deeper and more thorough review. University Committee Recommendations to the Provost

- Communication and accessibility with committee members would improve if rosters contained live links to the individual's staff directory profile.
- Because the Provost committee location is the sole source for information on each of these
 committees, it is requested that the charge and membership selection process for each of the
 committees be clearly stated. This will assist the rotating Senate in determining how it might
 assist with items relevant to its own purview and communicating with faculty members assigned
 to each of the committees.
- Request that the Provost office consider executing further review on the General Studies Council and Ombudsperson Committee. The Senate is happy to assist in this review to ensure that both of these important committees are functioning efficiently and effectively.
- Recommend that the University Senate office implement protocols to ensure that each of the committees noted above receive annual correspondence to offer assistance and/or to receive an annual report. Each annual report will be housed on the University Senate website for Academic Assembly member review.



• The committee also reviewed Bylaw II. D. and made the following observations and recommendations:

The committee believes that periodic review of the University committees is necessary and recommends only one small change to Bylaw II. D.

Current wording

University standing committees and boards report to the university president, filing a copy of all reports promptly with the UAC for transmittal to the appropriate liaison senate standing committee(s).

Proposed wording

University standing committees and boards report to the university president, when requested, filing a copy of all reports promptly with the UAC for transmittal to the appropriate liaison senate standing committee(s).

Conclusion

The review of the Provost roster of committees boards and councils was an important exercise in determining ways in which the Senate might better assist university level initiatives by working collaboratively with peer committees. It was agreed that in order to efficiently accomplish this level of collaboration University committee website rosters and charge and membership narratives should be as detailed as possible. Overall, the committee found that there was strong faculty representation throughout the university committee system. Utilizing primarily anecdotal information and feedback, the committee is concerned that the Ombudsperson's Committee and the General Studies Council may benefit from additional and more thorough review.

This ad hoc committee reminds the Senate that continued diligence on the part of subsequent Senate leadership teams will be critical to maintaining, and strengthening, the insertion of the faculty perspective into ASU decision-making.

Provost standing committees webpages tend to be easy to use and to feature tightly yet clearly written and precise mission statements as well as well-organized lists of membership. However, the absence of live links to membership profiles, outdated profiles, or underdeveloped profiles erects an unnecessary wall between webpage viewer and content.
