- Shared governance is both an opportunity and an obligation mandated by A.R.S. 15-601 and ABOR 6-201.
- The basic representational unit of the Senate is the degree granting unit.
- Units with fewer than 40 Academic Assembly members receive one Senator, units with 40 but less than 100 Academic Assembly members receive two Senators and units with 100 or more Academic Assembly members receive three Senators. Academic Assembly member definition: Click here.
- Senators are located on each of the four ASU campuses:
 Downtown=18, Polytechnic=13, Tempe=75, West=7

A Common Misconception

"New courses that are to be taught by ASU online are processed/approved via a different route than icourses or face to face courses."

False: ASU Online does not offer classes. ASU Online, in-person and iCourses are all formats by which academic units offer approved ASU courses. All ASU course proposals, regardless of delivery method, originate from an academic unit and must follow the university's review and approval process. This process includes curriculum committee review(s) at the department/school and/or college/school level, University review, and finally Senate review. Once course proposals receive the necessary approvals and are implemented, courses may be scheduled as ASU campus courses (in-person/iCourses), or through ASU online.
